

CONTEXT

The project deals with the memories and lessons we had from the last 70 years.

- **The project is set in a context of precariousness of European countries at political, economical and social levels.**
- **Some aspects and values of European Democracies seem to be threatened by Euroscepticism, populism and the rise of the far right in media and the centrifugal forces induced by Brexit must be countered by COHESION, SOLIDARITY and SECURITY.**



It is crucial to take action before facing the enormous negative impact of these phenomena on the EU, one must think strategically and act with caution.

The human rights contained in the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU (2000) will be presented to young Europeans, since the four countries evolved in the project (Greece, Spain, Poland and Bulgaria) knew periods of suppression of these fundamental rights.

To introduce young Europeans to the human rights set out in the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights (2000). The rights – dignity, freedoms, equality, solidarity, citizenship, justice – seem indisputable.

Main Goals

To stand symbolically within the limits of time and space from Bulgaria to Spain, and from Greece to Poland.

To bring together participants from countries with more than 30 years of EU membership with those accepted only 10 or 15 years ago; countries developed under conditions of capitalism and socialism; residents of capitals and of two big, but not metropolitan cities.
